Já sabemos como funciona o simple present em frases afirmativas. Agora vamos aprender como funciona em frases negativas e frases interrogativas.

Nas forma **negativa**, usa-se o auxiliar **do** para os sujeitos **I**, **you**, **we**, **they** e o auxiliar **does** para os sujeitos **he**, **she**, **it** (3<sup>a</sup> pessoa do singular), e **not** antes do verbo principal, que volta para sua forma básica(base form).
